## Our Community

Bainbridge Island is a beautiful 28 square mile island located just eight miles across Puget Sound from Seattle. Approximately 24,000 people call Bainbridge Island home. The island community places a very high value on the quality of the public school system. Community support for our school is evident in the long history of funding through consistent passage of school tax measures, a very successful Bainbridge Schools Foundation and the significant presence of school volunteers on a daily basis.

## Our School

**Bainbridge High School Mission Statement:** Inspiring all members of our school community to value learning, think critically and creatively, practice integrity, and act as compassionate citizens.

Bainbridge High School is the district's only comprehensive high school serving approximately 1,326 students in grades 9-12. Students at Bainbridge High School have access to a challenging college preparatory curriculum that is augmented by a rich and diverse array of elective classes. Our range of course offerings and co-curricular programs exceeds the options available at virtually any other public school our size. Our seniors' grade distribution helps to put the highly competitive nature of our school into better perspective (see the Cumulative GPA Distribution Class of 2021 chart on page 2).

# Graduation Requirements

*Bainbridge High School made the 'Top 500 STEM High Schools' in the nation (ranked 359) and 5th in Washington State for public high schools, according to Newsweek*

One-half credit is awarded for successful completion of a semester long course. Students must earn a total of 24 credits to graduate. Most students carry a full course load consisting of six classes in both the fall and spring semesters. See course distribution below:

**Honors Courses:** Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Applied Statistics, American Studies, Humanities. While there are not specific Honors classes in 9th and 10th grade English, students can earn an Honors designation by demonstrating exceptional work.

**AP Courses:** Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics, Computer Science, Computer Science Principles, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, U.S. Government, Micro & Macro Economics, European History, Psychology, English Literature, Spanish, and Studio Art (2D, 3D, Drawing). Students in AP courses are required to take the AP Exam.

**Running Start:** A statewide program offering juniors and seniors the opportunity to take classes at local community colleges. Students earn both high school and community college credit for these courses. These courses carry "RS" at the beginning of the course title on the student's transcript.

**Alternative School Classes:** Course codes that end in the letter "E" indicate a class taken at the school district's alternative school (Eagle Harbor High School).

## Grades and Class Rank Policy

All grades, by state mandate, are not weighted. All courses, except those denoted with a "P," "W," or an "NC" are calculated into a student's cumulative GPA. Bainbridge High School does not provide class rank.

**Covid Impact:** BISD was closed to in-person learning from March 2020-February 2021. Synchronous and asynchronous learning were provided. March 1, 2021, students returned to a half-day in-person hybrid model. From March 2020-June 2021, BISD implemented a modified grading scale: A, B, C, Pass or Incomplete. For the 2021-2022 school year, students are in-person full time with the traditional grading scale restored.

# University and College Enrollment 2018-2021

Last year 85% of Bainbridge High School graduates had plans to continue their education, 79% at a four-year institution and 6% at a two-year institution.
