Bainbridge High School Technology Goals

Technology Literacy Goal 1: Improve technology literacy for all staff and students at Bainbridge High School.

SMART Goal Statement: All staff and students will receive annual and ongoing training in technology standards and will have opportunities to increase their levels of technology literacy.

Strategy: Use the ISTE NETS to develop technology literacy skills and goals for all staff and students.

Rationale: The increased development of technology literacy skills by both students and staff members at BHS will result in enhanced levels of personal productivity and improved learning outcomes for students.

Evaluation Procedure: We will assess the technology skills and knowledge of our staff and students through annual surveys and ongoing observations. Administrators will use the results of these surveys to set and work towards yearly proficiency improvement goals.
