

**Bainbridge High School  
Site-Based Council Meeting Minutes  
September 22, 2015**

In attendance: Principal Duane Fish, Sarah Lucioni, Brian Messing, Joanne Meins, Aidan Meidell, Michele Blackford, Deana Lyon, Katie Erickson, Derrick Lovelace, Barbara Shane, Ashley Crandell

SBC members introduced themselves and identified their roles. General initial discussion regarding SBC goals, topics, procedures. SBC intent is to review draft School Improvement Plan for introduction to District in early November. Overall District goal is education / success for all students.

Principal Fish made a motion for Brian Messing to continue as SBC Chairman for the 2015-2016 school year. Motion was seconded and passed by unanimous voice vote.

**Principal's Report**

Staffing Update: Several teaching positions were filled over the summer. Reviewed the list of new hires. Some staffing notes: Patrick Dalrymple has been hired as the new choir director but is not on the list; the CTE program is eligible for federal funding and the emphasis this year under Peggy Templeton's direction is to provide more valuable content; open position for full-time psychologist; open position for behavioral specialist.

Scheduling: Very little flexibility for freshmen in particular to make schedule changes. Course withdrawals will appear as W's on transcripts.

Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA): Despite community concerns about the difficulty of the SBC, actual results state-wide were significantly higher than the State's anticipated baseline scores. Discussed the significant 11<sup>th</sup> grade student refusal rate and its effect on federal funding and integrity of the data. Refusals are reflected as 0% test scores. As a result, BISD will need to outline how it will allocate Title I funds to address the artificially low test scores.

100 Building Replacement: Two independent studies have identified the 100 Building as the 2<sup>nd</sup> most in need of replacement. (1<sup>st</sup> is Blakely.) Community meeting September 30<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in the LGI at which District representatives will present several replacement options. Estimated bond to replace the 100 Building and Blakely is \$60-\$80 million.

**Homecoming Events (Sanctioned vs. Non-Sanctioned Events)**

Saturday Seattle events are not school-sanctioned. Principal Fish will address appropriate behavior with students at Friday's assembly and the expectation that they will represent their community respectfully.

**Parking at BHS**

Principal Fish will ask the District to perform adequate maintenance (striping, lighting, signage, etc.), to more clearly delineate reserved parking spaces and fire lanes.

**Important Future Items for SBC**

#BeKindBHS: Pro-kindness approach to bullying rather than an anti-bullying initiative.

Increased 0/ 7 / Summer Recovery Options: Class of 2019 will need 24 credits to graduate, leaving no room for course failures or electives. Consideration of a 7-period day has been escalated to the District level. Cost for extra staffing is considered prohibitive.
