

Parent's Guide to Math Resources

The math department at BHS has adopted a very rich set of resources to help all our students be even more successful. This guide will point out the resources your teacher believes are some of the most important ones for students to be using regularly.

All resources are accessed via <http://my.hrw.com> Students have their log in information.

Once students are logged in they are presented with three choices, please click:

1. Go to the online textbook

Once you click that link there are three red tabs at the top of the screen.

Book Pages

Use Book pages to find exact pages out of the book. You can use the pull down menus at the top of the page or enter in a page number to go directly to a particular page.

When you are looking at a page in the textbook – Look to the right hand side of the screen:

1. Enlarged Book Page –English This will open up a PDF file of that particular lesson. Use this to print out pages or to download the lesson to an offline device such as an iPod touch or to email to a Kindle.
2. Lesson Tutorial Videos – These are videos that go along with every single example for every lesson in the book. Miss a class or didn't understand a teacher's explanation? We now have video lessons that can help.
3. Multilingual Glossary – Clicking on a term here will open up a definition for that word.

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Student Resources

There are two columns to this resource, on the left side you will find resources for the entire chapter while on the right are resources for each section of the chapter.

1. On the left side look for “Interactive Practice Test”. This is a quiz for the entire chapter that students can take as many times as they like. The teacher never sees the results of these, they are meant for practice only.
2. On the right hand side click the + next to a specific lesson. There are two things that are very valuable here.
 - a. Interactive Practice Quiz – this is a quiz on that specific lesson and again the teacher never sees the results of the quiz. It is meant for the students to study from.
 - b. Homework Help – Use this while working on homework. It gives specific videos or hints for almost every single homework problem that a student will work on from the textbook. This should be used daily.

Videos and Activities

This tab contains a variety of resources like videos and tools.

1. On the left hand side is a list of all the videos for the entire chapter all in one place.
2. On the right hand side look for “Tools” and then Scientific calculator

I hope you now understand the richness of the resources available to students. We have moved from a static textbook to large collection of resources which enable students more opportunities to learn both at school and at home. There are more resources available than what is outlined here and you should feel free to explore those as well.
