

POLICY 2120: CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK DEVELOPMENT

Curriculum framework development is a continuous process conducted for the purpose of revising and updating the content and methods of the education program to meet the current and future needs of students as they face an ever-changing world. The goal of a district curriculum framework is to provide students with coordinated and sequential learning experiences as they progress through the grades or move from one school to another within the district.

In this continuous effort of curriculum framework development, the creativity of the individual teacher shall be encouraged. At the same time, the community shall be encouraged to contribute ideas and suggestions for improvement to the educational program. The superintendent shall establish procedures for curriculum framework development which provide for review of subject areas on a cyclical basis, implementation of recommended changes within the limitation of district resources, and the involvement of community representatives and staff members.

The Board of Directors shall act upon the recommendation of the administration on the approval of new programs, major revisions of existing curriculum, student learning objectives, textbooks, and other instructional materials.
